NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY (NOFA)
FOR THE
PROGRAM YEAR 2027-28 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM

San Bernardino County, as a direct recipient of federal Community Planning and Development (CPD) funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), announces the availability of funding for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program for the 2027-28 Program Year. These funds are designated to support projects that provide decent housing, create suitable living environments, and expand economic opportunities, particularly for low-to moderate-income individuals and communities.

The County seeks applications from eligible entities, including cities and nonprofit organizations, capable of delivering public services or capital improvement projects that align with the goals outlined in the County's HUD Five-Year Consolidated Plan.

For the 2027-28 Program Year, beginning on July 1, 2027, the County anticipates receiving approximately \$7 million in CDBG funds. Of this estimated allocation, approximately \$4.7 million is anticipated to be available for eligible projects and programs within the County's CDBG Urban County program, including approximately \$2.6 million for participating cities. Funding amounts are estimates and are subject to adjustment based on the final CDBG allocation received from HUD. These funds are available for use in Participating Cities under the County's CDBG program. To be eligible, projects must meet one of the three HUD national objectives:

1. Benefit low- to moderate-income persons.
2. Address or eliminate slums and blight.
3. Address urgent community needs, such as natural disasters.

The following cities and surrounding communities are part of the County's CDBG Participating Cities Program: Adelanto, Barstow, Big Bear Lake, Chino, Colton, Grand Terrace, Highland, Loma Linda, Montclair, Needles, Redlands, Twentynine Palms, Yucaipa, and Town of Yucca Valley.

Applicants from these cities are encouraged to apply for funding. Examples of eligible activities include:

- **Public Service Activities:** such as senior services, health services, legal services, and employment training.
- **Capital Improvement Projects:** including infrastructure improvements, neighborhood facilities, and special needs facilities.

HOW TO APPLY

Applications for CDBG funding will be available starting Monday, September 14, 2026. The NOFA can be found on the Community Development and Housing website: <https://cdh.sbcounty.gov/community-development-and-housing-department/nofas-notice-rfps/>. The deadline for submitting applications is **Thursday, October 15, 2026, by 4:00 P.M.** Applications must be submitted online at [2027-28 San Bernardino County CDBG Application \(Cities\)](#). Any applications received after the deadline will not be accepted.

NOTE

The following cities are not part of the County's CDBG Participating Cities Program, as they receive federal HUD funding directly: Chino Hills, Fontana, Hesperia, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, Rialto, San Bernardino, Upland, Victorville, and the Town of Apple Valley. Applicants in these cities should contact the relevant city directly for application details.
